



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

New Family Information

Welcome to Summit Christian Academy. Now that you've become part of the SCA Family, this page will keep you updated.

How do I set up RenWeb our online portal account?

- SCA uses RenWeb School Management Software to allow students and parents to view academic information specific to their children. You can see your child's grades, attendance, homework and conduct, order lunch, as well as other useful school information. Please see the link under New Family Information for RenWeb Instructions.

What should I know about uniforms?

- Parents are required to purchase solid colored uniform-style pants, capris, shorts, skirts, skorts (culottes), and polo-style shirts from any vendor. Pants, capris, shorts, skirts, and skorts must come to the waist and look like uniform items. Approved solid colors include khaki, navy, royal blue, true red, and white. The official Summit Christian Academy red/navy plaid from Parker or French Toast is also acceptable for girls to wear. **No other plaids are acceptable.** Students may wear their choice of closed-toe shoes. Shirts must have sleeves.
- **School Logo Shirt and P.E. Uniforms**
Kindergarten through fifth grade students are required to purchase a Summit Christian Academy polo-style, navy blue, school logo shirt from Parker Uniforms. You may call Parker at 512-451-1667 or visit Parker's Online Store, www.parkersu.com to place your order. Shirts are to be worn for field trips, special events, etc. All PE uniforms are to be purchased through Parker Uniforms as well. Red P.E. Shorts with a white EAGLES logo and a heather gray P.E. t-shirt with a red SCA logo are required for grades Pre-K-8th grade.

What about School Supplies?

- School supply lists will be posted on the website in February.
- Parents may choose to purchase school supplies on their own or may purchase through our PTF (Parent Teacher Fellowship) as a fundraiser for our PTF for \$75.00 for PK-8th and \$65 for 9th-12th. Packages will be available in your homeroom on Meet the Teacher Night.

What about Summer Reading?

Students entering grades PK-5th

- The list of reading assignments will be available by grade, beginning the first week of June on our website: www.summiteagles.org . Go to the “Academics” tab, select Summer Reading.
- Students entering 1st through 5th grade have required summer reading assignments that have been carefully chosen to enhance and supplement the curriculum and skill objectives for each grade.

Students entering grades 6th- 12th

- The list of reading assignments and required novels will be available on the website beginning the first week of June. These assignments are due the first day of school. Go to the “Academics” tab and select grade.

What food service is available?

Summit serves breakfast and hot lunch every day. Breakfast is served Monday-Friday from 7:00-8:15 a.m. The lunch menu includes a balance of healthy choices and also includes Gluten free choices.

- Parents may send cash with their student for lunch each day or they may charge their RenWeb account. Funds will be debited from your bank through FACTS ACH on a monthly basis. You may keep track of these charges through your RenWeb account.
- Hot lunch includes one carton of milk or lemonade for \$4.25
- Parents may order lunch or lunches by going to their RenWeb account, click student, then lunch. You will then be able to see all the lunch choices for the current month. Students may also place their order each morning.

Is extended care available?

Before school care may be available for Pre-K through fifth grade for students needing to arrive at school between 7:00 and 7:30 a.m.

After school care is available for students through fifth grade. Drop-in care is also available for a limited number of students each day. A separate registration package is required for after school care and must be completed and approved by the childcare director before a student may attend. There is a registration fee to cover supplies and activities, as well as a monthly or drop-in fee. There is limited space available for before/after school care. Students will be accepted on a first-come, first- served basis. What volunteer opportunities are available?

- All parents are encouraged to get involved in some aspect of volunteer work at Summit.
